## **3D Artifact Model**



Click the link below and interact with a 3D model developed by our museum archaeologist. The artifact is an iron bar shot found at the wreck site of pirate-slaver Guerrero (1827). The ship hit a reef near Key Largo while being pursued by a British antislavery patrol vessel. Guerrero sank with its human cargo of 561 Africans, 41 of whom drowned.

# What is a Blue Star Museum?

The Blue Star Museum program is a collaboration among the National Endowment for the Arts, Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense, and more than 2,000 museums that offer free admission to our active duty military personnel and their families from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

The program was developed to improve the quality of life for the one million children who have had at least one parent deployed by offering these families a chance to visit museums during the summer despite limited resources and limited time together.

After accompanying Dr. Jones on a pre-opening tour of the galleries, Kendrick says " Dr. Jones has taken hundreds of priceless objects from textiles to precious metals to reveal the culture and traditions of the Inca people. This has been an ambitious undertaking. Every object was selected to illustrate an advanced and mysterious culture. Everything is incredibly well done." Spanning more than 4,000 sf DMA added to their collection with items lent from across North America. Bone carvings, ceramics, and military textiles reveal the hierarchical society that the Europeans encountered when colonizing the New World.
