This article involves responsible metal detecting and the community. While practicing the hobby of metal detecting there have been a number of issues and questions that continues to come to one's attention. These issues have been evident while metal detecting at large, at club hunts, in metal detecting conversations and during some recent club visits as VP of the Western Chapter. So what are the issues and questions?

Generally, it is the lack of knowledge by both new people to the hobby and some old timers. This lack of knowledge covers issues like where one can / cannot go metal detecting, proper methods of pin-pointing and minimizing ground cover damage during target recovery. I am sure that most everyone who metal detects has been exposed to similar situations and has seem first hand the results of very poor target recovery, or has talked to someone who has been asked to leave a specific detecting place due to lack of permission. As more people start to practice the hobby proper training and guidance will become essential for responsible detecting. Without proper education / training the result will be damaged property, public entities banding metal detecting, and arrests; all negatively impacting the reputation of the hobby.

enforced. Permits were even issued up until a year or two ago. A new parks director took over and enforced the ban. There was a TV news report on the issue featuring the Tri-State club.

The club contacted the director and initiated a conversation. After several meetings they worked out a permit system with a set of rules. They even took the man out and showed him what the hobby is about along with proper target recovery. The director, Aaron Young, was very receptive. In the end the ban was overturned and they are back to hunting the parks. With a few limitations as to a few off-limits areas and anything of historical importance must be turned in. Along with anything (rings for instance) with identifying marks. Pretty much all common sense rules.

This one went very well due to all parties proceeding in a respectable manner. We especially thank the parks director who did exactly what he is supposed to do. He responded to the request and worked out the differences. This is really refreshing to see and does not happen often. Usually we hit a wall and must take other action to break through it.

We do not always have to get the whole organization involved. Each issue must be looked at individually to see what the best way to proceed will be. Much of it depends on how receptive those we need to deal with are. In this case it was a "very receptive". In other cases it is a "not at all".
